



Part-Time Teaching Opportunity in Criminal Justice: Criminological Theory

The Guilford College Department of Justice and Policy Studies is accepting applications for part-time adjunct faculty to teach the following course for the spring 2021 semester:

- *JPS 333: Criminological Theory*
 - Course description: Advanced survey of criminological theory, covering sources of data about crime, the socioeconomic characteristics of both offenders and at-risk populations and the nature and theorized causes of criminal offenses.
 - Course schedule and mode of delivery: 12-week term starts January 11 and ends April 9, 2021. JPS 333 is currently scheduled as an online synchronous class with meetings on Zoom on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00-3:00pm; however, if you are interested in this opportunity and this schedule does not work for you, please indicate this in your cover letter and we can see what alternatives are possible.

Minimum Qualifications

- Master's degree in criminal justice, criminology, or related field from an accredited college or university OR J.D. with practical experience in criminal justice.
- Teaching experience at a college or university, and experience using Canvas as a course management system, is a plus.
- Commitment to excellence in teaching and working with a diverse student population.
